

# UCSD Global Seminar Faculty Proposal Summer 2008

UCSD will be offering a new study abroad option, UCSD faculty-led programs abroad beginning summer 2008. These programs will be called Global Seminars. We anticipate that ten Global Seminars will be offered. Diversity in academic scope and geographic location are very important factors. Participation by each college and by a broad range of disciplines is essential to providing courses that appeal to a wide range of students.

These seminars are specialized international teaching opportunities. Faculty will teach two courses totaling eight units during summer session one. Class size will range between 15 to 30 students depending on pedagogical factors as well as student demand. Courses will generally be taught in English, but the potential exists for courses to be taught in other languages. The Programs Abroad Office will offer required workshops for faculty and orientations for students. In order to insure high quality, we will use outside program providers with an established track record for all logistics, such as arranging for classrooms, excursions, local transportation, housing, and events.

Faculty leading a Global Seminar will submit a program proposal and assist in the finalization of the program itinerary in light of the budget. They will actively publicize the program and recruit students. Participation in faculty and student orientations is mandatory. Faculty will understand and be able to implement the risk management plan, code of conduct, and sexual harassment policies. Faculty must fly to the destination with students, teach courses and maintain academic focus of the program as well as submit all financial documents, collect program evaluations and post academic grades all within University guidelines. Faculty must obtain the approval of their department chair to teach UCSD Global Seminar courses. The approval document is located in this packet.

The Compensation package for teaching the 2008 Global Seminar includes a \$15,000 base salary for both courses (8 units). This is based on enrollment of 15-25 students. Salary will increase by \$300 for every additional student beyond 25 up to 30. Also included is a generous package of benefits, including roundtrip airfare with open return time, housing, entrance fees for course-related excursion sites, meal allowance, funds for guest lectures, local transportation, international health insurance, and a \$500 contingency fund.
